




Communication and Language

Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding

Maintain attention in most contexts

Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities.

Listen to and talk about nonfiction books to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary (linked to growing seeds and the Queen's Jubilee amongst others)

Ask questions to find out more and check understanding.

Listen to and, follow multi-step instructions

Speak in well formed sentences Use the past tense appropriately.

Share ideas and feelings about characters in books





At Home

Use past, present and future tenses correctly while speaking e.g. instead of "I goes" you should say "I went"





Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

Think about the perspective of others

Work as part of a team e.g playing team games and creating models and art as a group

Attempt to resolve problems independently i.e. through negotiation Manage own needs.

Show good manners and respect to others

Seek out a challenge and enjoy the process

Practice good hygiene

Maintain attention in different contexts and for a longer period of time.

Talk about the importance of washing hands before eating and after visiting the bathroom or gardening.

Physical Development

Develop a deeper understanding of the importance of a healthy diet linked to our growing and harvesting activities

Threading, cutting, weaving, playdough, fine motor activities. Working hard to form letters correctly

Handling tools, objects, construction and malleable materials with increasing control


Draw freely

Hold small items / button clothing / cut with scissors.

Confidently and safely use a range of large and small apparatus indoors and outside.

At home

Play lots of ball games with your friends and family. Can you throw, catch, kick, roll and bounce the ball to one another?



Literacy

Comprehension: Retell stories using and understanding recently acquired vocabulary

Discuss the characters in a story

Suggest how an unfamiliar story, read aloud to them, might end.

Recall the main points in a story in the correct order

Answer questions about the text to clarify understanding

Engage in play influenced by experience of books.

Anticipate key events in stories

Word Reading: Read some digraphs and trigraphs and say sounds for them.

Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter-sound correspondences and, where necessary, a few exception words.

Emergent writing: Build words and write labels, captions and simple sentences using known letter sounds in writing. Re-read what has been written to check it makes sense.

Write for different purposes e.g. speech bubbles, labels, instructions

Composition: Orally compose a sentence and hold it in memory before attempting to write it and use simple conjunctions.

At home

If you draw a picture can you label it? Can you re-tell a story we have read in school to your family?

Understanding the World

Look at similarities and differences in our own and other environments

Healthy eating linked to our growing and harvesting lessons

Comparing and contrasting seeds, plants, fruits and vegetables

Planting vegetables

Observing plants grow over time

Observing the transition of the season from spring to summer by going on walks and watching the weather

Learning about the lifecycle of a caterpillar through the text "A very hungry Caterpillar"

Comparing Lymm now to Lymm in the past

Understanding that time passes in sequential order

Learning about people who help us (visit from a policeman)

Learning about the Queen and the Jubilee

Becoming familiar with the idea that some places are special and significant to different people. Learning that a church is a holy place for a Christian, a mosque is a holy place for a Muslim and a Mandir is a holy place for a Hindu.

At home


Can you grow your own seeds or vegetable tops? Discuss how you will celebrate the Jubilee.
