

#### **Book Fund Appeal**

To date our appeal for your help with reading books has generated £1650 via ParentPay, plus a few parents have made larger donations through their businesses as previously mentioned, meaning that we have over £5k to spend on books! We cannot thank you all enough for this amazing support.



We have begun to clear out old and tatty books from our stocks in readiness for the new books we can now afford to purchase, thanks to the generosity of our parents. Thank you also for the large number of good quality books that have been donated to us. In the coming weeks we are ordering hundreds of new books for our reading scheme collection and our library. We will soon be able to share photographs of them being used by your children.

#### **Christmas Cards and Gifts**

Sadly we cannot allow children to bring individual Christmas cards into school this year to distribute to their friends... Handing out 30 individual cards does not fit with our risk assessment where we are limiting sharing of any resources or equipment. We sanitise essential, shared equipment such as PE, Science and music resources between each use. This is not possible with Christmas Cards. If they would like to write one card to the whole class, we are happy to put this on display in each classroom.

A number of parents have asked if they are still able to send a gift to members of staff. This is definitely not expected, but always appreciated. We are still able to accept gifts, if parents wish to send them in, and will arrange for appropriate quarantine arrangements. As much as we love homemade items, we'd be grateful if you don't send in homemade edibles this year.
