



# **Well-Being**

During the current time of uncertainty, as we all play our part to control the spread of the virus, it is particularly important to look after our own well-being and that of our children. The additional measures we have in place at school are effective but put an additional pressure on the team. To combat this we have introduced a 'dress-down' day for staff on a Friday, to keep morale high.



We also have a number of activities for your children's well-being in place too.

These include:

- yoga;
- mindfulness colouring;
- relaxation and breathing techniques;
- use of our running track;
- 'I-moves' physical activity routines.

Our aim is to help them build strategies to cope with the challenges that normal life inevitably brings. We also feel passionately that the children should not be disadvantaged by the pandemic. Many social events are cancelled and mixing with friends away from school is restricted. Therefore, it is even more important that we continue to make our school the vibrant, happy place that it is. To achieve this, we have increased the number of themed lunch days on offer and also aim to have a fun workshop or a non-uniform day, each half term for all children. #### **COVID-19 Reminders:**

- Our website has a range of COVID-19 resources and guidance documents, saved under Parent/Covid-19.
- ParentApp now has a separate folder for all letters related to Covid-19 in one place.
- ParentApp has been set up with a tab on the homepage to allow you to inform us of any Covid-19 test results.
- Test results that are logged via the App are emailed immediately to my email address and also to our Business Manager, Mrs Lynch. This means that we take swift action, as soon as we are informed of a case, to let parents know if their child's 'bubble' needs to isolate.
- The government are keen for everyone to download the new NHS Track and Trace App. See App logo shown here:
- Should another class (bubble) have to isolate, please be assured that we are
  ready to switch from lessons in school to remote lessons. Our aim is to make this as seamless and
  normal as possible to reduce any anxiety for all concerned.
