

Dear Parents and Families,

Finance Update

Unfortunately, due in part to the pandemic, this year Cherry Tree is facing a £37k deficit budget. Being one of the lowest funded schools in Warrington, coupled with increased COVID costs and a significantly reduced income stream this year because of COVID measures, this has meant we have been unable to balance the budget. The Governors and I work very hard throughout the year to scrutinise spending, ensure value for money and find new ways to generate income. However, due to a significant loss of rent from After School Club and Preschool as well as not being able to run holiday camps, after school activities and fundraising events has resulted in a £13k loss of income, since April. This combined with the fact that our costs have increased has put us into a deficit. To date, additional, and essential Covid expenditures have included:

- · Essential sanitiser products;
- PPE equipment;
- Additional resources for separate bubbles;
- · Staff overtime to cover key worker camp during holidays and extended school hours;
- · Supply cover for staff who have had to isolate;
- Subscriptions for online resources.

These unexpected additional COVID costs have to be met from our school budget. I'd like to thank you for supporting us by purchasing individual stationary packs for your child- this has saved us hundreds of pounds! (For example, 200 glue sticks costs £100 for the cheaper version!). Thank you for also contributing to the additional activities that we offer in school such as the African drumming day. These offer children a wealth of important experience and we are grateful to parents for their support. We are also grateful to all our families for supporting PTA fundraising efforts wherever possible.

Despite the deficit, I would like to reassure you that the staff team, Governors and I are working hard to ensure that we continue to provide outstanding education to all those at Cherry Tree. Our excellent staff team are working together, going above and beyond, to deliver high quality lessons under unprecedented conditions.

The Governors and I wanted to make you aware of our financial situation. It is taken for granted that schools have enough money to buy everything they need. This year we do not. Warrington LA is well aware of our situation and are making regular pleas to the government to recognise the financial strain being placed on ALL schools as a result of the pandemic.

We are grateful to have been allocated £16,000 COVID Catch-Up Fund. This is being used to pay for additional teaching assistant hours, meaning that we can provide more support for children across the school.

We appreciate that times are hard at the moment but, if you can, please do support the PTA's fundraising efforts and requests for contributions to schools activities. We do this <u>only when we absolutely have to</u>. Where possible, please consider a regular donation to the 'Development Fund' (Form saved in letters home on the App). The money is used to ensure we can continue to provide the necessary resources to everyone at Cherry Tree.

Volunteers and Visitors

Due to the National Lockdown, we will not be allowing parent volunteers or visitors into the building. The only exceptions are: parents who run extra-curricular clubs (mainly taking place outside and in their normal bubble); governors; professionals who deliver support/lessons for children and student placements.

We are unable to arrange any face to face meetings with parents or ask them to support in school, until after the lockdown ceases.

Virtual Tour of the School

Our 'Virtual Tour' of the school, created by a group of Year 6 pupils, can now be found on our website. This will hopefully give any new families who cannot visit in person a chance to see our school in action and to receive an enthusiastic commentary from Millie, Isabelle, James and Sophie. We are very fortunate to have excellent behaviour at Cherry Tree. Our children work hard, are thoughtful and compassionate and treat one another with respect. This is not something that happens by accident; we constantly reinforce the positive behaviour that we wish to see throughout the school. We have a 'Behaviour Charter' that we



follow, a copy of which can be found at the end of this Newsletter. However, we feel it is very important to emphasise that any form of discrimination or bullying is unacceptable and to give our children the skills and knowledge to know what to do should they come across it occasionally.

During the week commencing Monday, 16th November, our children will hear some important messages in relation to anti-bullying. We will begin the week with an 'ODD SOCKS Day' in order to celebrate our individuality and differences. No donation required, just wear some odd socks!

- ✓ Parents need to wear a face covering on site and follow our one way system.


