

Cherry Tree News Headlines

Cherry Blossom Preschool

As previously mentioned, the management and administration of Cherry Blossom Preschool (formerly known as St Mary's Preschool) has transferred to Cherry Tree School. We are at the beginning of an exciting journey together as we strengthen the relationship between the two settings and further develop the



provision in the Early Years. An external consultant is working with us to make enhancements to the outdoor and indoor environment and to provide staff training.

Year 6 Residential

The cancelled and re-scheduled visit to Burwardsley Residential Centre finally happened for the majority our Year 6 children on Monday and Tuesday this week. They had a wonderful time and gave the following feedback: "The best part was when we built dens in the forest... the food was good but not as good as at Cherry Tree!" Rayyan Adam

Covid-19 Update at Cherry Tree

On Monday morning we had a number of cases of Covid-19 within Year 6, reported to us ahead of their residential visit. This meant that unfortunately, five children were unable to attend the trip. Having five or more cases in one class meets the threshold for further protective and preventative measures and is known as an 'outbreak'.

We have been advised by Public Health Warrington to reduce interaction between the Year 6 class and other cohorts, therefore Year 6 will: have their own area of the playground at break times; go for their lunch first; join assemblies virtually; pause their roles such as being a Buddy or Receptionist. These measures will be in place for the shortest amount of time necessary, i.e. until cases have returned to below the threshold.

Face to face education remains the priority for all pupils, including trips and residential visits. Any child who tests positive for Covid-19 is required to isolate for ten days. If a child is not unwell but has to isolate due to current guidelines, we will provide them with remote learning activities during their isolation period.

Children who are off sick will not be set remote learning activites as they obviously need to focus on getting better and resting.

Covid-19 Symptoms in Children (Source NHS.co.uk)

Children can get coronavirus (COVID-19), but they seem to get it less often than adults and it's usually less serious. The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, (for more than an hour) or having 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

What to do if your child has symptoms

If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, even if they're mild:

- Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) to check if they have COVID-19 as soon as possible.
- Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result they can only leave home to have the test.
- Check if you and anyone else your child lives with need to self-isolate
