

Cherry Tree News Headlines

Warrington Borough Council Update

Professor Steven Broomhead met with Warrington Head Teachers this week to give an udpate on the Covid situation across the borough. Professor Broomhead began his presentation with a thank you to all school leaders for their resilience throughout the pandemic, he also gave thanks to everyone within the Warrington community for their support and compliance in terms of following guidance and adherering to restrictions.

Below are some statistics to illustrate the current situation:

- 48 primary schools have with more than ten cases (Fortunately, Cherry Tree has a low number of cases this week.)
- Warrington hospital is under pressure but coping:
 - o 98 people are in hospital as result of covid (17% of bed-availability, as a direct result of Covid.)
 - 6 patients are currently in the intensive care unit as a result of covid (this time last year there were 40 patients)
- 85% of eligible groups in Warrington are double vaccinated and 60% have had the booster dose.

Covid Update at Cherry Tree

This week we have had no new cases among staff and 3 cases among pupils.

Although our cook Jenny has recovered and returned to work, the school meals service we buy into is still being affected by staff shortages. This is causing unavoidable changes to the regular menu. However, we are still providing a hot, nutritious meal to those children who wish to purchase one.

Thank you for your understanding and support in helping us to manage the ongoing situation.

Islam Workshops

Bethan Marrington and Sophie Lewis both from Y6, have provided the following report about the Islam workshops which took place on Thursday, 13th January:

On Thursday, Imran Kotwal came to visit. He did a whole school assembly which we all enjoyed to discuss the five pillars: Belief, Prayer, Charity, Fasting and Pilgrimage. He then visited each class in turn to discuss different topics all covering the religion of Islam. In our class he told us about his own experience of pilgrimage to Mecca. We loved being visited by Imran and he filled us with lots of new knowledge about Islam and Muslims.
