

Covid Update at Cherry Tree

This week we have had no new cases among staff or pupils this week. © Face coverings are now optional for any adults who come into school.

Covid Anti-Body Study / School Infection Survey (SIS2)

I have been given the following update from the SIS2 team:

SIS2 is the only study in the UK that is actively testing school pupils for COVID-19 antibodies and the results of these tests and data from the questionnaires are being used by the Government and SAGE (Scientific Advisory Group for Emergencies) to help inform their planning and understanding of the pandemic, the current and longer- term effects of COVID-19 on the health and wellbeing of children and how we build back from it

This week has seen the first publication using data from SIS2 questionnaires in Round 1 (November – December 2021). These questionnaires completed by yourselves, the parents and the pupils play a critical role in understanding the impact the pandemic is having on the health and wellbeing of school children. This information will play a key role in future policy and decision making. Here is the link that will take you to that publication:

<u>COVID-19 Schools Infection Survey, England: Attitudes to Vaccines and Preventative Measures, November to December 2021</u>

The significance of this survey continues to gain professional support. A comment mentioned at the latest schools 'Scientific Advisory Group' (SAG) stated this as being "An important moment in history for understanding the longer-term impacts of SARS COVID-19 on school pupils".

I would like to thank those families who have given consent for their children to participate in this important study. A letter has been posted on ParentApp with a link to follow should any additional families wish to sign up.

Parents who have given consent previously do not need to do anything further. (NB: This study is for primary school aged children, not those who attend Cherry Blossom Preschool.)

ALLOTMENT NEWS Help needed please

Many of the raised beds on the allotment are in need of new sides and unless this is addressed soon we will not be able to use them this growing season. The cost to replace the sides with wooden panels is too high and therefore our Allotment Co-ordinator, Jan Daniel has come up with an environmentally friendly solution where we use recycled materials to re-build our planters.

Our aim is to recycle 2-litre plastic bottles filled with plastic waste into 'plastic bricks' which will then form the walls of the planters. We would like your help in the production of lots of plastic bricks by the end of February. Please read the information at the end of this newsletter regarding how to make a plastic brick.

Save Our Planters / Plastic Bricks Project

Please help by creating some plastic bricks at home. Bring them into school once complete.

What do I need to make an Eco Brick / plastic brick?

Any plastic that can be crushed in your hand as long as it is clean and dry. For example:

- Any plastic used to wrap bread products
- Biscuit and cake wrappers
- Snack wrappers and crisp packets
- Plastic film off the top of fruit packs
- Plastic fruit and vegetable bags
- Plastic wrappings from the top of cooked meat packs
- Cheese wrappings
- Cling film and plastics used to wrap vegetables
- Plastics used to wrap paper products e.g. toilet rolls/kitchen rolls
- Plastic net bags used for fruit/vegetables
- Plastic bags used for frozen fruit, vegetables, Quorn, etc.-
- All other plastic bags as long as they are clean and dry
- Bubble wrap
- Any other plastic that can be squashed, as long as clean and dry, can be used

How do I make a plastic brick?

- 1. Large pieces should be either cut or pulled apart to make it easier to push into the bottle
- 2. Plastics that have food residue on should be rinsed and left to dry
- 3. Push the pieces of plastic into the bottle.
- 4. Compress as tightly as possible to make the bottle feel solid.
- 5. Use something strong to push the pieces into the bottle, such as a piece of doweling or a garden cane until there is no space left.
- 6. Put the lid back on the bottle
