

Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs)

It is three years since children last took SATs tests at Cherry Tree! Our **Year 6** children were not fazed by their statutory assessments last week. They have all worked incredibly hard and we hope they are proud of their many achievements at Cherry Tree, including their SATs results when they arrive in July (Tuesday, 5th July). **Year 2** have begun to complete their SATs tests within their classroom over a two week period. The Year 2 tests are done in a more informal way, appropriate to their age group and overall results are supported by teacher assessment.

After half term, **Year 1** will take the Phonics check which is completed 1-2-1 with the class teacher; the Year 1 children have already completed three of these checks in preparation over the past year so this is not at all like a formal test.

Finally, **Year 4** have their Multiplication Check in June. This is a short, time-limited test to check their knowledge of all the multiplication tables up to 12 x 12.

As I mentioned in a message before the Year 6 SATs tests, no exam or test can assess those important qualities that make each of our children unique and special. These assessments undoubtedly give school and the DfE some valuable information about attainment and progress at our school and across the country, for comparative purposes, but they do not provide anywhere close to the full picture of what our children have achieved. To be successful in life children need to have a wide range of skills and attributes which cannot be assessed by a test. It is always our aim to help our children be the best that they can be in all areas of the curriculum as well as helping them succeed in Maths and English.

Sports Competition Update

We are continuing to build our reputation as school that is very active, with some very talented children. Over the past two weeks we have taken part in three competitions and have the following updates and photos to share with pride:

- Year 4 Football Team went to Everton to play in the county final. They played really well as a team and
 encouraged each other throughout. They just missed out on the chance to be in the final and came joint
 third overall!
- Year 3 also went to Everton to play in a county final for their year group. Mr Cope was one of their coaches, he told us: "Eight schools took part; Cherry Tree were the only ones not from Liverpool. They played against some big, physical city kids but never backed down and frankly were the best team in all games played."
- Our cross country team took part in an annual event at Woolston Primary School. I am very proud to share the news that out of 20 schools, our boys' team won, the girls' team came second and Jake Harrison (Y6) was the first child across the line. This meant that we were the overall winners of the competition! We now have two shields proudly on display in our front entrance hall!
- Today, Year 6 went to the Warrington round of the Road to Finch Farm competition and I am very pleased to tell you that they won and are now through to the final at Finch Farm!

REMINDERS:
