THANK YOU and WELL DONE

Firstly, thank you to all of the children for their outstanding performances this Christmas. The Key Stage 1 production of 'Santa's on Strike' was uplifting and fun last week; then yesterday our Key Stage 2 carol concert at St Mary's was magical and brought our community together with a mixture of pride and laughter. our staff and parents cannot be underestimated in enabling these events to happen, you are all truly appreciated. \odot

STREP A

We have been notified of three confirmed cases of Strep A within the last ten days; two in Year 4 and one in Year 6.

What are scarlet fever and Strep A?

Scarlet fever is caused by bacteria called Group A streptococci (Strep A). The bacteria usually cause a mild infection that can be easily treated with antibiotics.

In very rare occasions, the bacteria can get into the bloodstream and cause an illness called invasive Group A strep (iGAS).

What are the symptoms of Strep A/scarlet fever?

Strep A infections can cause a range of symptoms that parents should be aware of, including:

- Sore throat
- Headache
- Fever
- A fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel
- On darker skin the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel

If a child becomes unwell with these symptoms, parents should contact their GP practice or contact NHS 111 (which operates a 24/7 service) to seek advice.

If a child has scarlet fever, they should stay at home until at least 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading the infection to others.

INFECTION CONTROL

The following information has been taken from government advice:

Many infectious diseases can be managed by reinforcing the following measures:

- encouraging all people who are unwell not to attend the setting or remain separate from others, wherever possible further guidance on exclusion periods is available for specific infectious diseases
- ensuring all eligible groups are enabled and supported to take up the offer of <u>immunisation programmes</u> including coronavirus (COVID-19) and flu
- ensuring occupied spaces are well ventilated and let fresh air in
- reinforcing good hygiene practices such as frequent <u>cleaning</u> and <u>hand hygiene</u>
- requesting that parents, carers or students inform the setting of a diagnosis of any infectious disease

Our team have reinforced messages around good hygiene and 'catch it, bin it, kill it' and will continue to do so in the New Year.

I do hope that those members of our community who are poorly, especially the children make a speedy recovery.

PLAY EQUIPMENT UPDATE

We apologise for the delay in having our new play equipment ready for use. The equipment has not been checked and signed off by the contractor yet, and children are NOT allowed to play on it. This is because the weather has prevented final work to be completed on the safety surface.

As soon as it is possible to complete the work and the final safety checks, we will let you know.

Please do not allow any children to use the equipment whilst waiting to drop off/collect your children.
