

Cherry Tree News Headlines

Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs)

Our **Year 6** children have all worked incredibly hard during their tests this week. We hope the children are proud of their many achievements at Cherry Tree, including their SATs results when they are published (Tuesday, 11th

July). We are delighted with the progress that our Year 6 children have made since joining us, in all areas of the curriculum.

Year 2 will complete their SATs tests within their classroom over the next two weeks. The Year 2 tests are done in a more informal way, appropriate to their age group and overall results are supported by teacher assessment. After half term, **Year 1** will take the Phonics check which is completed 1-2-1 with the class teacher; the Year 1 children have already completed three of these checks in preparation over the past year so this is not at all like a formal test.

Finally, **Year 4** have their Multiplication Check in June. This is a short, time-limited test to check their knowledge of all the multiplication tables up to 12 x 12.

No exam or test can assess those important qualities that make each of our children unique and special. These assessments undoubtedly give school and the DfE some valuable information about attainment and progress at our school and across the country, for comparative purposes, but they do not provide anywhere close to the full picture of what our children have achieved.

To be successful in life children need to have a wide range of skills and attributes, which cannot be assessed by a test. It is always our aim to help our children be the best that they can be, in all areas of the curriculum; as well as helping them succeed in Maths and English.

New Cook

Our new cook, Vicky Quinn has started her induction and training period at Cherry Tree this week. Vicky has moved from a position at Bridgewater High where the team made over 300 meals per day; she is looking forward to becoming fully involved at our school and has some themed days planned for the future.

A parent has reported a 'near miss' to the school office this morning, on Hardy Road. May we remind all parents to drive with extreme caution and at low speeds when dropping off or collecting children at school.





This half term, our preschool children have been using the text 'The Hungry Caterpillar' to inspire their learning. They have been looking at life cycles and have been involved in planting vegetables.

The children have also begun to come over to the main school hall for their lunch; we love having our youngest children in the hall with us at lunchtime, their behaviour has been excellent!

Attendance and Punctuality

School starts and <u>registration takes</u> <u>place at 9am</u>; we expect all children to arrive before this time.

The minimum percentage attendance we expect is 97% attendance. This means missing no more than 5 days per year.

Health and Safety Update

A brief reminder that the Governors and I would like to make you aware that **parts of our playground surface are uneven** and could potentially present a trip hazard. Should you require assistance in accessing our school site, please contact the school office and we would be happy to help.

We have made a request to Warrington Borough Council for funding to replace the tarmac in the areas where the tree roots have damaged the playground surface; in the interim, we have sprayed these areas yellow to indicate that the surface is uneven.
