

#### **School Environment Improvements**

We have a few projects that are in the planning stage which will enhance our school environment. Hopefully one or more of these projects will be completed over the summer break- watch this space.

Our school continues to have a deficit budget due to increase costs and unfunded pay rises for staff. With that in mind, the governing board and I are keen that our families understand that these projects are all funded by the local authority or with ring-fenced money that can only be spent on building projects. Without these additional funding streams we would not be able to afford any of the following:

- Removal of tree roots and trees near the playground porches
- Re-surfacing various areas of the tarmac on the playground/pedestrian access to eliminate trip hazards
- New entrance porch at the front of school
- Partition between Year 2 and Year 4

#### New Finish Time for Years F, 1 and 2

From September 2023 we will be lengthening the school day for Class F, 1 and 2 by FIVE minutes.

Our new collection time for Class F, 1 & 2 will be <u>3:20pm</u> from Tuesday, 5<sup>th</sup> September onwards This will reduce the waiting time for families who have children in KS1 (Infants) and KS2 (Juniors) and provide our youngest children with an extra 25 minutes in school each week.

#### **REMINDER: September Changes**

In order to enhance our EYFS provision, we will be making some adaptations to the day-to-day running of Cherry Blossom Preschool.

#### **Three Years + Sessions**

From September we will be limiting three of the afternoon sessions to preschool children only (age 3+) so that we can focus on helping the older children to be school-ready.

On a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoon

a slightly more formal approach will be adopted to prepare children who are aged 3 or 4 for the transition to Foundation Stage (Class F). This means that we will not be able to accommodate children under 3 years old within these sessions. Also from September, the sessions will be split as follows:

Morning 8:45am - 11:45am Afternoon 12:15pm - 3:15pm

Children will still be able to do both sessions and bring a packed lunch. Lunchtime for children staying for the full day will be from 11:45am – 12:15pm.

#### **School Meals Price Increase**

#### A message from Paula Worthington, Director of Education

Please be advised that the cost of a school meal is set to rise from £2.40 to £2.60 from September 2023, resulting in an overall weekly increase of £1 per child.

This is the first price increase in school meals since 2019 as the council has prioritised supporting families in these times of hardship. Where possible, the council will continue to subsidise services where it can and are looking at support for those families that are struggling but are not eligible for free school meals. Further information on this will be shared in the new academic year.

The three weekly rolling menu detailing each day's main course and dessert, with the additional daily offer of a vegetarian option and jacket potato will remain in place. The school meals service will continue to provide a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements, and is served in a safe environment on our school premises. We will continue to offer theme days, treat lunches and inviting families to join children for special lunches through the year.
