

Parking on Hardy Road

Warrington Borough Council has added a new dropped kerb with a tactile surface on both sides of Hardy Road, close to Lyme Grove. This is to provide accessible pavement access for wheelchair and pram users and also to support anyone who is visually impaired. Please DO NOT park in front of this dropped kerb. In case you are not aware, blocking or obstructing any dropped kerb is against the law, and a penalty can be issued. Our PCSO has been to monitor the parking on a few occasions. He will return on a regular basis and will issue a ticket to anyone blocking this dropped kerb. Thank you for parking considerately for the benefit of everyone.

Attendance and Punctuality

Please support us in maintaining good attendance and punctuality.

School starts and registration takes place at 9am; we expect all children to arrive BEFORE this time.

The minimum percentage attendance we expect is 97%. This means missing no more than 5 days per year. Our full Attendance Policy can be found on the website under the 'About Us' tab.

Following on from Parent Forum Feedback last week, we will be introducing a **'High Attendance Award'** at the end of each full term. This is to recognise those children who have only had an occasional day off due to illness. Each term will 'reset' so there are three opportunities to achieve a 'High Attendance Award' over the course of the year.

Appointments

Please be aware that due to logistics and safeguarding issues, if your child needs to leave or return to school during the school day, this needs to be **before 12 noon or after 1pm i.e. not during lunchtime**. It is disruptive if children have to leave school part way through eating their lunch or return when their peers are eating. To gain their afternoon registration mark, children need to be in school by 1:15pm.
