All children have the opportunity to be involved in inter and intra- school sports events, as well as engaging with high quality arts experiences such as participation in specialist music lessons, live performances and art exhibitions. In addition, we run an extensive range of over 20 extracurricular activities each term such as netball, coding, football, choir, French, Spanish, drama, guitar, piano, chess, cross-country, crafts and many more.

By working closely with parents, we develop a spirit of partnership in our quest to equip our children with the best start and learning patterns for life. Curriculum Implementation

We believe children learn best when they actively engage in their learning through meaningful and applied contexts. We help children to develop a positive 'can do' approach that enables them to become independent, resilient learners who develop self-belief. We focus on learning approaches that require children to apply their skills and knowledge through problem solving and reasoning.

We enjoy being part of a very strong local community. Many community events such as Dickensian Day, Lymm May Queen Parade, Lymm Festival, local writing competition, Round Table Fireworks display are organised by external local groups. We are keen to build community cohesion and make every effort to promote and be part of these important family events. We also ensure that our curriculum takes advantage of everything our local community has to offer.

In addition, the school ensures that children have exposure to a wide experience beyond their local community, through for example, sporting events, residential visits and visiting speakers from other religious denominations and groups. Our strong-rooted core values gives us an excellent platform for embracing difference.

Our children are compassionate and caring and willingly take on responsibilities across the school.
