Examples of questions to ask when listening to your child read

FICTION

Can you think of a more effective verb/adjective/simile/adverb?

What words tell us how the character is feeling?

Can you select the words/phrases used to describe the setting?

What do you think will happen next? Can explain why you think that?

How do we know.....? Ask for evidence from the text.

How might you solve the problem in the story?

How does the poet give you a fantastic picture?

NON-FICTION

What would you like to find out about the Romans?

Where can you find information about the Romans?

Can you use the index to find the chapter that you need?

Can you use the glossary to find the meaning of a word?

Can you use the contents page to find the chapter that you need?

Examples of tasks to do after reading all or part of a book.

Investigate and collect sentences/phrases for story openings and endings.

Write a description of a setting in a book.

Write a narrative story using 5 chapters.

Write a super report on information that you read in your book.
