Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of your child's education at Cherry Tree Primary School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme.

We are writing to inform you about the updated statutory guidance for Relationships, Sex, and Health Education (RSHE). As you may be aware, the updated Department for Education guidance becomes mandatory for all schools. To ensure our curriculum reflects these changes and meets the needs of our community, we are launching a parent and carer consultation period running from Friday 12th June to Friday 10th July.

What Your Child Will Learn in KS2

Our PSHE and RSE curriculum is designed to be age-appropriate, sensitive, and supportive. The updated curriculum focuses on three core areas:

- **Healthy Relationships:** Friendships, respecting differences, family structures, and conflict resolution.
- **Keeping Safe:** Offline and online safety, understanding personal boundaries, and knowing how to seek help if they feel unsafe.
- **Growing and Changing:** Understanding physical and emotional changes during puberty, personal hygiene, and self-care.

How will it be delivered?

We will be using My Happy Mind as our main resource. Hopefully, your child has already talked about the scheme. The updated My Happy Mind scheme covers all the aspects of the PSHE curriculum. The updated scheme will be available from September, but the current curriculum is available on the My Happy Mind app. If you have not done so already, please download the My Happy Mind app using and use the following number:111150.
